

# CACCI President to Visit VCCI and KADIN Indonesia



CACCI President Ambassador Benedicto Yujuico is scheduled to visit two countries in early August 2011 - Vietnam in August 11-12, 2011, and Indonesia in August 15-16.

During these visits, Amb. Yujuico will meet with key officers of the Vietnam Chamber of Commerce and Industry (VCCI) in Hanoi and of the Indonesian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (KADIN-Indonesia) in Jakarta. He will be accompanied by a number of CACCI members who are interested in exploring market opportunities in the two countries.

Amb. Yujuico and his delegation will be received by Dr. Vu Tien Loc, Chairman and President of VCCI at the Chamber's headquarters in Hanoi on August 11. The meeting will be followed by a lunch to be hosted by Dr. Vu.

After lunch, the delegation is scheduled to make a courtesy call on the Ministry of Industry and Trade of Vietnam, followed by another courtesy call on the Ministry of Planning and Investment.

In the evening, the CACCI President will host a dinner for the VCCI officers and members to provide them another occasion for networking with the members of the CACCI delegation.

On August 12, the CACCI delegation will fly Ho Chi Minh City to visit the Vietnam Stock Exchange

and local companies.

From Ho Chi Minh City, the delegation will proceed to Jakarta, where they will meet with KADIN Indonesia

Chairman Mr. Suryo Bambang Sulisto and other officers and members of the Chamber.

The Secretariat has also requested KADIN Indonesia to arrange courtesy calls on relevant government agencies in charge of trade and investment.

The Vietnam and Indonesian visits are part of Amb. Yujuico's program to provide CACCI members the opportunity not only to establish contacts with key representatives from the private and government sectors of the host countries, but also to learn first-hand the business conditions and opportunities available there.

Founded in 1963, the VCCI is an independent, non-governmental, non-profit chamber with a legal status and autonomy of finance. It represents the business community, employers and business associations in Vietnam for the purpose of development, protection and to support business.

Officially established in 1968 as an association of Indonesian entrepreneurs, KADIN-Indonesia provides direct services to 32 provincial chambers and more than 422 regency branches.
